Facts about Latvia



Total area: **64,589 km2**

Population: **1.85 million** (est. 2023)

53 % of the area is covered by forest (2022)



Wolves in Latvia

Wolf hunting is legally allowed in Latvia (Annex V of the 1992 Habitats Directive)

Hunting allowed under strict supervision of State Forest Service (SFS) and scientific authorities (maximum limit 300 individuals)

Estimated wolf numbers: ca. 1300 (SFS data, 2022)

Hunting season:


from July 15 until the limit is filled but no later than March 31

Season 2022/2023: **Limit – 300, bagged - 300**






Wolf population dynamics in Latvia





Wolf limit and bagging data per hunting seasons






Wolf distribution map 2021/2022


Hunting requirements

- On the spot: wolf teeth photo including date and GPS
- E-mailing the photo to SFS, along with wolf sex/age info and hunter contact data
- SFS can adjust wolf limit and/or hunting requirements
- For the **last 10 wolves**, hunting must be coordinated with SFS





Wolf attacks on domestic animals confirmed by SFS in 2017-2022



No financial compensations for wolf damage and/or prevention measures

Actual number of wolf attacks can be larger



Confirmed wolf damage

(mostly sheep, though attacks on dogs, goats and cattle also are recorded)

2021 - **51** attacks

Killed: 129 sheep, 7 cattle, 5 dogs, 5 red deer in fenced area

Wounded: 22 sheep, 1 goat

Lost: 13 sheep

Total number of domestic animals damaged: 182

2022 - **79 attacks**

Killed: 256 sheep, 5 cattle, 10 goats, 4 dogs


Wounded: 102 sheep, 1 cattle, 4 goats

Lost: 113 sheep, 1 goat, 1 dog

Total number of domestic animals damaged: 497
